This letter responds to your request to the Office of National Drug Control Policy ("ONDCP") under the Freedom of Information Act ("FOIA"). Your request has been designated as FOIA 2024267.

FOIA does not require agencies to create new documents, conduct research, or compile data in response to a request.

If you are not satisfied with the action on this request, you may submit an appeal in writing. To be considered timely, it must be submitted electronically or postmarked (in the case of postal mail) within 90 calendar days from the date of this response via U.S. postal mail addressed to FOIA Appeals Officer, Office of National Drug Control Policy, Executive Office of the President, 1800 G Street NW, Washington, D.C. 20503. ONDCP strongly recommends using electronic means for submitting appeals. Due to COVID-19, appeals submitted through conventional mail delivery services may not be received in a timely manner.

You also have the right to seek assistance from ONDCP's FOIA Public Liaison at (202) 395-6622 or from the Office of Government Information Services (OGIS). OGIS offers mediation services to resolve disputes between FOIA requesters and federal agencies as a non-exclusive alternative to litigation. Using OGIS services does not affect your right to pursue litigation.
